[4] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #4) vs. Marta Kostyuk (UKR #27)

Tied 1-1

Rybakina and **Kostyuk** have a 1-1 head-to-head, with **Kostyuk** winning in three sets at Adelaide last year, and **Rybakina** exacting revenge in the first round of last year's US Open

Rybakina stands alone as this year's match-win leader (25) and is seeking her tour-leading third title of the season

Two of **Rybakina's** seven career titles have come on clay (2019 Bucharest and 2023 Rome)

Rybakina is also this year's ace leader (207) and has hit an average of 8.7 aces per match this week

Including her win over Swiatek in SF, **Rybakina** has now beaten a World No. 1 player on five occasions, and four of those have come against Swiatek

Rybakina is through to her fifth final of the season, having lifted the championship trophy in Adelaide and Abu Dhabi. She was also the runner-up in Doha and Miami

Rybakina is the first player to reach five finals in the season's first four months since Victoria Azarenka in 2012

Kostyuk has won 7 of her last 10 matches against Top 10 players, including three consecutively to reach this week's final

Kostyuk is the first player from Ukraine to reach the Stuttgart final, besting Elina Svitolina's SF appearance from 2021

Kostyuk is 1-1 in WTA finals, winning the Austin title last year and finishing runner-up in San Diego last month; **Kostyuk** is looking for her first WTA 500 title with a win today

This is **Kostyuk's** second singles final appearance at the WTA 500 level in the 2024 season (San Diego, Stuttgart). This is **Rybakina's** third WTA 500 level final (Abu Dhabi, Brisbane, Stuttgart)

The last Stuttgart champion ranked outside the Top 20 was No.49 Laura Siegemund (2017 won)

Kostyuk has beaten three Top 10 opponents in a row, with her upset of Vondrousova following hard-fought victories over No.5 seed Zheng Qinwen and No.3 seed Coco Gauff

With a win, **Kostyuk** is projected to make her Top 20 debut (otherwise will move to No.21) – a career-high either way. **Rybakina** will stay at No.4

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached second Grand Slam final at 2023 Australian Open (l. Sabalenka in 3s); made Top-10 debut following tournament (January 30, 2023). Also in 2023 won first two WTA 1000 title at Indian Wells and Rome and finished R-Up at Miami. Qualified for first WTA Finals, going 1-2 in Group Stage.
 - Lifted maiden major at 2022 Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F)
 - In 2022 also finished R-Up at Adelaide (l. Barty) and Portoroz (l. Siniakova)
 - Best result of 2021 were SFs at Eastbourne, Olympics and Chicago [500], and QFs at Abu Dhabi, Roland Garros, San Jose and Ostrava
 - Opened 2020 season by reaching the championship match at four of her first five tournaments, including a title run at Hobart (d. Zhang in F)
 - Made first final appearance at a Premier-level tournament with R-Up finish at St. Petersburg (l. Bertens); was rewarded with Top 20 debut at No.19 following run in Russia (February 17, 2020)
 - First win over a Top-5 ranked opponent came over No.3 Ka.Pliskova during R-Up finish at 2020 Dubai
 - Won back-to-back Slam matches for the first time during 3r showing at 2020 Australian Open (l. Barty)
 - Won maiden WTA singles title at 2019 Bucharest (d. Tig in F), breaking into Top 100 for the first time in the following week's rankings at No.65 (July 22, 2019)
 - Also in 2019, went on to make Top 50 debut on September 16, 2019, after reaching second career final at Nanchang (l. Peterson), produced SF appearances at Luxembourg and 's-Hertogenbosch, and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2019 Roland Garros, falling 1r (as qualifier, l. Siniakova)
 - Finished 2019 campaign with 57-21 win-loss record (across all levels) to end season at No.37, up from 2018's final ranking of No.191. On the ITF Circuit in 2019, lifted silverware on three occasions: back-to-back at \$25k Moscow-RUS and \$25k Kazan-RUS, and at \$60k ITF/Launceston-AUS
 - Highlights of 2018 included reaching maiden WTA QF at St. Petersburg (l. Goerges) and clinching title at \$15k ITF/Kazan-RUS

 - Won first ITF Circuit title of career at \$25k ITF/Dunakeszi-HUN in 2017 (d. Pera in F)
 - Played first WTA qualifying at 2017 Mallorca (l. Kalinskaya in 1r)
 - Ukrainian Fed Cup Team 2018-20
 - Won 2017 Australian Open girls' singles title (d. Masarova in F) and ITF Junior Masters event in Chengdu, China in October 2017; rose as high as No.3 in junior rankings in June 2017
 - Played first professional event at \$10k ITF/Kharkhiv-UKR in August 2016 (fell in 1r)
