Linda Noskova (CZE #14) vs. [4] Elina Svitolina (UKR #7)

Noskova leads 2-0

Noskova:

- Making 2nd appearance at Stuttgart; she reached R16 here in 2024 (l. Raducanu)
- Has reached her 2nd QF of the year (also made Indian Wells SF, l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Owns 11 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.7 Jessica Pegula at 2025 Beijing
- Holds a 4-1 career Tour-level record against players from Ukraine, with two of those wins coming over today's opponent Svitolina (one of those via injury retirement)
- Her one career WTA Tour singles title has come at WTA 500-level, at 2024 Monterrey (d. Sun in F)
- Before this year, the last time 2 players from Czech Republic reached QF at Stuttgart was 2021 (former Stuttgart champions Ka. Pliskova and Kvitova both lost in QF that year)

Svitolina:

- Making 3rd appearance at Stuttgart and first since 2021
- In her previous Stuttgart showings, reached SF in 2021 (l. eventual champion Barty) and QF in 2018 (l. Garcia)
- Owns two WTA 500 titles in her career, 2018 Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F) and 2018 Dubai (d. Kasatkina in F)
- Has won 21 Tour-level matches so far in 2026, 4th-most wins on Tour this year
- This year, she returned to the Top 10 of the PIF WTA Rankings for the first time since October 2021
- Has reached her 5th QF of the year after Auckland title (d. Wang Xinyu in F), Australian Open SF (l. Sabalenka), Dubai R-Up (l. Pegula in F) and Indian Wells SF (l. Rybakina)
- She is 4-0 in quarterfinal matches so far this year

[7] Karolina Muchova (CZE #12) vs. [2] Coco Gauff (USA #3)

Gauff leads 6-0

Muchova:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Stuttgart; she previously lost in 1r in 2021 (l. Alexandrova)
- Has won 20 matches so far in 2026, including claiming the second WTA singles title of her career at WTA 1000 Doha (d. Mboko in F)
- Has reached her 4th QF of the year, after Brisbane (SF), Doha (won title) and Miami (SF)
- She is 3-0 in quarterfinal matches so far this year
- Owns 18 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.9 Victoria Mboko at 2026 Miami (3-4 vs. Top 10 players this year)
- Her best WTA 500 results are 4 SF finishes, most recently at 2026 Brisbane (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Best results by Czech Republic at this event are title runs by Karolina Pliskova in 2018 and Petra Kvitova in 2019

Gauff:

- Making 5th appearance at Stuttgart and is into the QF here for the 3rd straight year
- Seeking her first Stuttgart SF after QF losses in 2024 (I. eventual R-Up Kostyuk) and 2025 (I. Paolini)
- Has reached her 4th QF of the year (also Australian Open QF, Dubai SF and Miami R-Up)
- Holds a 4-3 record vs. Top 20 players this year, with her most recent Top 20 win coming over today's opponent Muchova in 2026 Miami SF
- Two of her 11 career Tour-level singles titles have been on clay, 2021 Parma (d. Wang Qiang in F) and her 2nd career Grand Slam singles title at 2025 Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Also reached two WTA 1000 finals on clay last year at Madrid (I. Sabalenka in F) and Rome (I. Paolini in F)
- Has won one WTA 500 title at Washington DC in 2023 (d. Sakkari in F)

[3] Iga Swiatek (POL #4) vs. [6] Mirra Andreeva (#9)

Andreeva leads 2-1

Swiatek:

- Making 5th showing at Stuttgart, where she is a 2-time champion in 2022 and 2023 (d. Sabalenka in both finals)
- Swiatek won her first 10 matches at Stuttgart before her undefeated tournament record was ended by Elena Rybakina in the 2024 semifinals
- She has only lost to eventual champions at Stuttgart (Rybakina in 2024 SF and Ostapenko in 2025 QF)
- Seeking her first Top 10 win of the year, after losses to Top 10 players Gauff at United Cup, Rybakina at Australian Open and Svitolina at Indian Wells
- Aiming for her first Tour-level SF since her title run at Seoul last September
- She is a 6-time champion at WTA 500 events; her most recent WTA 500 title is 2025 Seoul (d. Alexandrova in F)
- 10 of her 25 career WTA singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is her fourth Roland Garros title in 2024 (d. Paolini in final)

Andreeva:

- Making second appearance at Stuttgart after reaching 2r in 2025 (I. Alexandrova)
- Claimed her second WTA 500 title last week at Linz (d. Potapova in F), after also winning WTA 500 Adelaide title earlier this year (d. Mboko in F)
- Her QF run this week has extended her current winning streak to 6 straight victories (6-0 on clay so far in 2026)
- Has won 20 matches so far in 2026; along with her title runs at Adelaide and Linz, she also reached quarterfinals at WTA 1000 Dubai (I. Anisimova) and WTA 500 Brisbane (I. eventual runner-up Kostyuk)
- Owns 10 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.10 Emma Navarro at 2025 Wimbledon (0-2 vs. Top 10 players in 2026, I. Anisimova at Dubai and I. Mboko at Miami)
- Owns two WTA Tour clay court singles titles: Linz in 2026 and Iasi in 2024

[1] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #2) vs. Leylah Fernandez (CAN #25)

Tied 2-2

Rybakina:

- Making 4th appearance at Stuttgart, where she claimed the title in 2024 (d. Kostyuk in F)
- Has won a total of five WTA 500 titles, including two last year at Strasbourg and Ningbo
- Contesting her 6th quarterfinal of the season; she has failed to reach QF only once in 7 events played this year, at Dubai (I. Ruzic in R16 via retirement)
- Seeking her 4th SF of the year after Australian Open title (d. Sabalenka in F for 2nd career Grand Slam title), Indian Wells R-Up (I. Sabalenka in F) and Miami SF (I. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Has won 22 matches so far in 2026; she is ranked No.3 on Tour for match-wins this year, behind only Pegula (24) and Sabalenka (23)
- Is currently ranked at a career-high of No.2, which she reached for the first time on March 16 of this year

Fernandez:

- Making debut appearance at Stuttgart
- Best WTA 500 result was winning the title at Washington DC 2025 (d. Kalinskaya in F); also reached another WTA 500 final at Eastbourne 2024 (I. Kasatkina in F)
- Has reached her first QF since SF run at 2025 Hong Kong (I. eventual champion and fellow Canadian Mboko)
- Owns 7 Tour-level wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.4 Jessica Pegula en route to 2025 Washington DC title (0-4 vs. Top 10 players since then)
- Also defeated today's opponent Rybakina during 2025 Washington DC title run - Rybakina was ranked No.12 at that time
- Career-best result on clay is quarterfinal at Roland Garros 2022 (I. Trevisan)
- Fernandez has become the first player from Canada to reach the QF here at Stuttgart

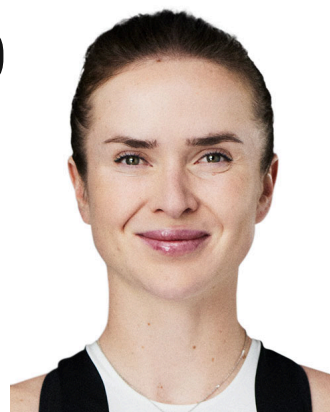

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached three Tour finals in 2025, including her first career WTA 1000 final at Beijing (l. Anisimova), as well as runner-up showings at Prague and Tokyo; made her Top 20 debut and finished at a career-high No.13 in the year-end rankings
- In 2024, achieved first Grand Slam singles quarterfinal at the Australian Open (l. Yastremska), where she also defeated then-World No.1 Iga Swiatek in the 3r; won her first singles title at Monterrey (d. Sun in F); reached SF at Prague (l. eventual champion Linette) and Brisbane (l. eventual champion Rybakina); earned a new career-high ranking of No.25 on August 26, 2024
- Breakthrough year in 2023, achieving runner-up twice; Adelaide 1 (as qualifier, l. Sabalenka) and Prague (l. Hibino). Also reached quarterfinals at Lyon (l. Osorio) and 3r at Indian Wells (l. Gauff) and Cincinnati (as qualifier, l. Gauff). Broke into Top 40 on October 9, 2023.
- Made Top 100 debut on August 1, 2022, following SF run at Prague (l. eventual champion Bouzkova); overtook Gauff at the youngest player in Top 100
- Also reached 2r at Tallinn (as qualifier, l. Haddad Maia) and fell 1r at both Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Raducanu) and US Open (as qualifier, l. Bouzkova). On ITF Circuit, lifted fifth and sixth titles at this level, winning W60 tournament in Croissy-Beaubourg, France and W100 event in Versmold, Germany
- Finished 2021 campaign with 38-9 win-loss record, winning four ITF Circuit titles, including at W60 event in Prerov, Czech Republic
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2020 Prague
- On ITF Circuit, owns six titles in singles and one in doubles
- As a junior, won 2021 girls' singles at Roland Garros
- Went 16-3 on clay at Tour-level events in 2025, including her 18th career title at Rouen, Madrid SF, Rome QF and Roland Garros QF; also made Australian Open QF (l. eventual champion Keys)
- Achieved runner-up in her opening tournament of 2024 at Auckland (l. Gauff in F) before finishing R16 at Australian Open (l. Noskova, retired due to low back injury). Reached QF at Wimbledon (l. Rybakina), 4r at Roland Garros (l. Rybakina) and 3r at US Open (l. Gauff). Ended season after US Open
- Returned to the Tour in April 2023, following birth of daughter Skai. Won Strasbourg (d. Blinkova) for a second time (also in 2020) before achieving Grand Slam results of QF at Roland Garros (l. Sabalenka) and SF at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)
- 2022 season reached 3r at Australian Open (l. Azarenka) and QF at Monterrey (l. Osorio), before going on maternity leave in spring
- Highlight of 2021 was lifting 16th career title at Chicago [250]. Also made SF at Miami, Stuttgart and the Olympics (won bronze medal)
- Won her 14th and 15th titles in 2020, firstly at Monterrey (d. Bouzkova in F) and then Strasbourg (d. Rybakina in F). Contested her 30th consecutive major at 2020 Australian Open (streak ended by missing 2020 US Open)
- In 2019, made first two Grand Slam SFs of career at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Halep) and US Open (l. S.Williams). Became the first woman from Ukraine to reach a major SF (on the men's, Andrei Medvedev made that stage at 1993 and 1999 Roland Garros, finishing runner-up in 1999)
- Also in 2019, made Australian Open QF and reached the title match as defending champion at the Shiseido WTA Finals (l. Barty)
- In 2018, won 13th - and most prestigious - career title at 2018 WTA Finals (d. Stephens in F), after going 3-0 during round robin stage. Ended year ranked No.4. Also won titles at Rome (as defending champion, d. No.1 Halep in F), Dubai (as defending champion, d. Kasatkina in F) and Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F)
- Enjoyed standout 2017, finishing year at No.6, winning a tour-leading five titles and posting second-most wins (53, behind Wozniacki with 60). Season culminated by qualifying for WTA Finals in Singapore, becoming first Ukrainian woman to qualify for the season-ending tournament in singles (fell at round robin stage with 1-2 record)

- In 2017, became first player to win three Premier 5 titles in a single season (Dubai, Rome, Toronto), since such tournaments were introduced in 2009
- One of five players to make Top 10 debut in 2017, after winning Dubai in February (also Ostapenko, Garcia, Mladenovic and Vandeweghe). Peaked in rankings at No.3 on September 11, 2017
- On four occasions could have reached World No.1 - at 2017 US Open, then needed to win 2017 Beijing (fell QF), then needed to triumph at 2017 WTA Finals (fell in group stage), or reach final at 2018 Australian Open (fell in QF)
- End to 2016 season also saw her reach first SF at Premier Mandatory level at Beijing (l. A.Radwanska). Qualified for 2016 WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai for the second time (l. Kvitova in F)
- Reached three finals in 2016, winning Kuala Lumpur (d. Bouchard in F) and R-Up at New Haven (l. A.Radwanska) and Zhuhai (l. Kvitova). Another 2016 season highlight was QF at Rio Olympics
- Owns two career doubles titles: 2014 Istanbul (w/Doi) and 2015 Istanbul (w/Gavrilova)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2012 Baku (lost in 1r but went on to win title there in both 2013 and 2014)
- Played first ITF Circuit events of career in 2008
- Junior highlights include winning 2010 Roland Garros girls' title at age 15 (d. Jabeur in F)

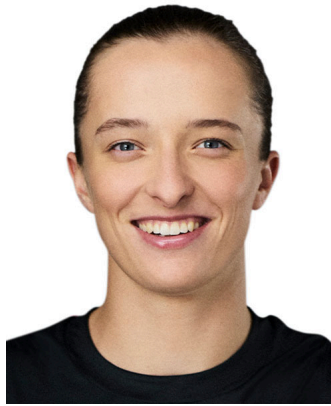

- Made WTA qualifying and main draw debut at 2017 Moscow (as qualifier, l. Begu in 1r)
- Professional debut came at \$10k ITF/Antalya-TUR in 2014
- In 2025, won multiple Tour titles in a calendar year for the first time, finishing as champion at WTA 250 Osaka and WTA 500 Washington DC (her first title above WTA 250 level); also partnered Venus Williams to make US Open doubles QF as a wild card team
- 2024 season highlights were reaching first final on grass finishing R-Up at Eastbourne (l. Kasatkina) and as part of title defense made SF at Hong Kong. Also reached final of Cincinnati in doubles w/Putintseva

- Reached first career WTA final and notched first tour-level back-to-back wins at 2020 Acapulco as qualifier (l. Watson in F); at 17y, 177d, she was the youngest Canadian to reach a WTA singles final in 34 years (since Helen Kelesi at 1986 Tokyo [Japan Open] won at 16y, 338d)
- Owns one singles title and two doubles titles on ITF Circuit

- Won 2019 Roland Garros junior singles title (d. Navarro) becoming first Canadian to win a junior Grand Slam since Bouchard in 2012
- Played first WTA main draw and earned first main draw win of career at 2018 Quebec City defeating countrywoman Dabrowski in 1r (L. Watson in 2r)
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in USA in 2016
