## DAY 3 – WEDNESDAY, APRIL 15

### [Q] Zeynep Sonmez (TUR #79) vs. [5] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #8)

First meeting

#### **Sonmez:**

- Making debut appearance at Stuttgart
- Posted her career-best WTA 500 results at Merida by reaching QF in 2025 and 2026
- This is only her 2nd career meeting against a Top 10 player after falling to No.10 Emma Navarro at 2025 Merida
- Best career Tour-level result on clay is R16 which she reached once at Rabat in 2025 (l. Sevastova)
- First time a player from Turkey has featured in the Stuttgart main draw
- Winner of this first-round match will face Leylah Fernandez of Canada in the second round

#### **Paolini:**

- Making 3rd appearance at Stuttgart, where her best previous result was reaching SF in 2025 (l. Sabalenka); also made QF in 2024 (l. eventual champion Rybakina)
- Her best WTA 500 result is semifinal which she has reached on six occasions, most recently Merida 2026 (l. eventual champion Bucsa)
- Has a 1-1 record against qualifiers this year (d. Sasnovich at Australian Open; l. Gibson at Indian Wells)
- Has won 8 Tour matches so far in 2026 with her best result achieved at Merida with semifinal (l. Bucsa)
- This is her first Tour clay match of the season

### [Q] Alycia Parks (USA #95) vs. [WC] Noma Noha Akugue (GER #195)

First meeting

#### **Parks:**

- Making 2nd appearance at Stuttgart; she fell 1r to Zheng Qinwen as a lucky loser in 2023
- Qualified for this week's main draw with straight-set wins over Eva Bennemann and Viktoriya Tomova
- Her best finish at a WTA 500 event is SF at 2025 Monterrey (l. eventual champion Shnaider)
- Career-best Tour-level result on clay is QF at 2023 Rabat (l. eventual champion Bronzetti)
- Top result so far in 2026 is QF at WTA 250 Ostrava (l. fellow American Volynets)

#### **Noha Akugue:**

- Making Stuttgart main draw debut this week as a wild card, after falling in qualifying in 2021 and 2023
- Contesting her first WTA Tour event of the year, and making her first-ever appearance in a WTA 500 main draw
- Career-best Tour-level result on clay is her run to the WTA 250 Hamburg final in 2023 as a 19-year-old wild card, which was also her WTA Tour main draw debut (l. Arantxa Rus in F)
- Seeking her first Top 100 win since defeating No.76 Martina Trevisan en route to 2023 Hamburg final
- Won two ITF singles titles earlier this year at ITF/W75-Altenkirchen and ITF/W50-Helsinki

**Jelena Ostapenko (LAT #22) vs. [6] Mirra Andreeva (#9)**

**First meeting**

***Ostapenko:***

- Making 8th appearance at Stuttgart, where she is the defending champion after claiming the title in 2025 (d. Sabalenka in F); also made quarterfinal in 2018 (l. Ka. Pliskova)
- Owns a total of five WTA 500 titles; along with Stuttgart 2025, also won 2024 Adelaide, 2024 Linz, 2022 Dubai and 2021 Eastbourne
- Owns 26 Tour wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.7 Jasmine Paolini at Miami 2026
- Has two clay court titles: Stuttgart in 2025; Roland Garros in 2017
- Her best result of the 2026 season is SF at Doha (l. Mboko), and she also made QF last week at Linz (l. Ruse) in her first clay event of the season

***Andreeva:***

- Making second appearance at Stuttgart after reaching 2r in 2025 (l. Alexandrova)
- Claimed her second WTA 500 title last week at Linz (d. Potapova in F) after also winning WTA 500 Adelaide this year (d. Mboko in F)
- Owns two clay court titles: Linz in 2026 and Iasi in 2024
- First career meeting on Tour against a player from Latvia
- Has won 18 matches so far in 2026; as well as title runs at Adelaide and Linz, also reached quarterfinals at WTA 1000 Dubai (l. Anisimova) and WTA 500 Brisbane (l. eventual runner-up Kostyuk)

**[3] Iga Swiatek (POL #4) vs. Laura Siegemund (GER #51)**

**Swiatek leads 2-0**

***Swiatek:***

- Making 5th showing at Stuttgart, where she is a 2-time champion in 2022 and 2023 (d. Sabalenka in both finals)
- Swiatek won her first 10 matches at Stuttgart before her undefeated tournament record was ended by Elena Rybakina in the 2024 semifinals
- She has only lost to eventual champions at Stuttgart (Rybakina in 2024 SF and Ostapenko in 2025 QF)
- Owns a 13-0 career Tour-level record against players from Germany (1-0 in 2026, d. Lys at United Cup)
- She is a 6-time champion at WTA 500 events; her most recent WTA 500 title is 2025 Seoul (d. Alexandrova in F)
- 10 of her 25 career WTA singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is her fourth Roland Garros title in 2024 (d. Paolini in final)

***Siegemund:***

- Making 9th main draw appearance at Stuttgart, where she is the 2017 champion
- Siegemund reached the first WTA singles final of her career here in 2016 (l. fellow German Kerber in final) and won the title the following year (d. Mladenovic in 2017 final, in 3rd-set tiebreak)
- Defeated Viktoriya Tomova in this week's 1r for her first match-win at Stuttgart since her run to the 2022 QF
- Owns 13 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.5 Mirra Andreeva at 2025 Wuhan
- Seeking her first Tour-level QF since 2025 Wuhan (l. eventual champion Gauff in that round)
- Both of her two WTA singles titles have come on clay: Stuttgart in 2017, and Bastad in 2016 (d. Siniakova in F)

**Eva Lys (GER #78) vs. [4] Elina Svitolina (UKR #7)**

**First meeting**

***Lys:***

- Making 3rd appearance at Stuttgart, and she has reached the R16 here for the 2nd time (previously reached R16 as a qualifier in 2022, l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Seeking her first-ever WTA 500 QF; she has made R16 at WTA 500 events on 4 occasions, including this week
- Defeated Paula Badosa in 1r for her 2nd match-win of the year (d. Lamens at United Cup)
- Holds a 1-10 record vs. Top 10 players, with her one Top 10 win coming over No.10 Elena Rybakina at 2025 Beijing
- Her career-best Tour-level result on clay is SF at 2024 Budapest (l. eventual champion Shnaider)

***Svitolina:***

- Making 3rd appearance at Stuttgart and first since 2021
- In her previous Stuttgart showings, reached SF in 2021 (l. eventual champion Barty) and QF in 2018 (l. Garcia)
- Owns two WTA 500 titles in her career, 2018 Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F) and 2018 Dubai (d. Kasatkina in F)
- Has won 20 Tour-level matches so far in 2026, 4th-most wins on Tour this year
- Is 11-0 in WTA Tour matches this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50
- This year, she returned to the Top 10 of the PIF WTA Rankings for the first time since October 2021
- Seeking her 5th QF of the year after Auckland title (d. Wang Xinyu in F), Australian Open SF (l. Sabalenka), Dubai R-Up (l. Pegula in F) and Indian Wells SF (l. Rybakina)

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, made history for her country at Wimbledon, becoming first Turkish player to reach a Grand Slam 3r in Open Era; also made Merida QF, and notched first WTA 1000 main draw wins of career in Beijing 3r run; reached career-high No.69 on October 20
- During 2024, won first WTA Tour title at Merida, becoming first Turkish player to win WTA Tour singles title since Buyukakcay at 2016 Istanbul. Also made QF at Monastir and entered the Top 100 for the first time, ending the year at a career-high of No.89
- Made her WTA Tour main draw debut in 2023 at 's-Hertogenbosch with a 1r (l. Andreescu) and followed up with a 1r at Hamburg (l. Pera). Contested Grand Slam qualifying for the first time in 2023 at Wimbledon and US Open
- In 2023, reached her first WTA 125 final at Ljubljana (l. Bassols Ribera) and further reached a WTA 125 SF at Kozerki (l. Yastremska)
- In 2022, lifted two ITF titles at 15K Monastir and 25K Sozopol
- In 2020, lifted one ITF title at 15K Antalya
- In 2025 earned second WTA 1000 title of her career on home soil at Rome, also winning the doubles title with Errani - became the first woman to sweep the Rome singles and doubles titles since Monica Seles in 1990
- Also in 2025 won her first Grand Slam title in any discipline, pairing with Errani to claim the Roland Garros women's doubles crown and qualified for the 2025 WTA Finals in both singles and doubles for the second time in her career after 2024
- Breakout 2024 season saw her win the biggest title of her career at WTA 1000 Dubai and also reach her first Grand Slam finals, finishing R-Up at Roland-Garros and Wimbledon. Qualified for her first WTA Finals in singles and doubles, broke into the Top 10 for the first time in her career and finished the season as the World No.4
- Finished 2023 by breaking into Top 30 for first time, achieving No. 29 on Oct 23, 2023 after becoming runner-up at Monastir (l. Mertens). Also achieved runner-up at Palermo and SF at Zhengzhou (l. Zheng both times) as well as QFs at Lyon (l. Garcia) and Cincinnati as a qualifier (l. eventual champion Gauff). Enjoyed two Top 10 wins (No.10 Garcia and No.4 Rybakina).
- In 2022, finished R-Up at Cluj-Napoca (l. Blinkova), while made back-to-back SF at Palermo (l. Bronzetti) and Warsaw (l. eventual champion Garcia); also reached QF at Lyon (l. Yastremska), Portoroz (l. eventual champion Siniakova) and Parma (l. Kovinic)
- Broke into Top 50 on January 31, 2021
- Posted near-Top 50 season finish in 2021 after capturing first WTA singles title of career at Portoroz (d. Riske in F)
- Strong season finish also brought SF run at Courmayeur (l. eventual champion Vekic) and QF effort at Linz (l. Halep); posted best win of season over No.18 Mertens en route to 3r at Indian Wells (l. Pegula)
- Also in 2021 won the WTA 125K event in Bol, Croatia (d. Rus in F) and was R-Up at the same level in Saint Malo (l. Golubic)
- Captured first WTA doubles title in 2021, at Hamburg (w/Teichmann)
- In 2021, for first time in career, contested the full suite of all four Grand Slam events; reached 2r at Roland Garros and US Open, equalling best previous Slam result
- In 2020, reached 2r four times at WTA tournaments, including Roland Garros (l.

- Kvitova)
- Highlights of 2019 included QF showings at Guangzhou and Palermo, a SF run at the WTA 125K Series event at Karlsruhe, lifting seventh, eighth and ninth ITF Circuit titles of her career, at \$60KBrescia-ITA, \$25K ITF/Curtiba-BRA and \$100K ITF/Tokyo-JPN, and qualifying for maiden Grand Slam main draw at Roland Garros (l. Kasatkina in 1r)
- Ended 2018 ranked No.180, with season highlight a maiden WTA singles QF at Prague (d. No.15 Kasatkina, l. Zhang)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bastad (l. Suarez Navarro in 1r) and also fell 1r at Guangzhou and in qualifying a further three times
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2015 Rome
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Italy in 2011

- Following her breakthrough in 2025, received the Athlete of the Year award at the Harper's Bazaar Türkiye Women of the Year ceremony in Istanbul  
Inspired as a child by attending the WTA Finals Istanbul and watching stars like Victoria Azarenka, Li Na, Serena Williams and Maria Sharapova; also served as a ballgirl at the Istanbul event where Buyukakcay made history
- A key to her 2024 rise was adding a more aggressive, net-rushing style to complement her strong movement, along with improved mental resilience following a heartbreaking Wimbledon qualifying loss to Daria Snigur
- She emphasizes hope, focus and sportsmanship, highlighted by a notable fair-play moment with Eva Lys in Monastir where both players corrected calls in each other's favor

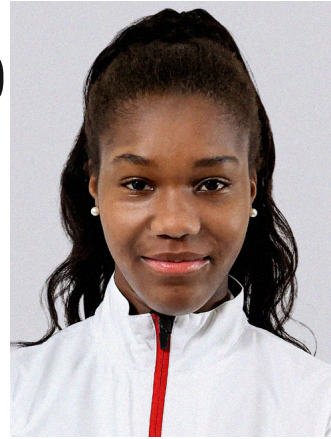

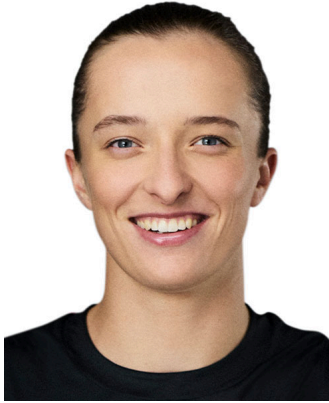

## CAREER MILESTONES

- Won three singles titles in 2025, including her first Wimbledon title (her 6th Grand Slam title overall), Cincinnati and Seoul; finished at World No.2 for the second straight season

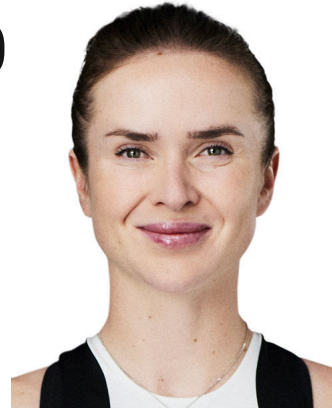

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025 reached QF at a WTA 1000 for the first time at Beijing (l. Gauff) and registered career-first Top 10 win over No.10 Rybakina in 3r. Also posted her best career Grand Slam result by 4r at Australian Open (as a lucky loser). Finished the season at a career-high ranking of No.40
- Standout results of 2024 came in the second half of the season with semifinals at Budapest (l. eventual champion Shnaider) and Monastir (l. eventual champion Kartal); also made QF at Osaka (l. Ito) and reached a career high ranking of No.105 in September
- Reached first career SF at 2023 Cluj Napoca (l. Korpatsch) and QF at Hamburg (l. Rus); defeated No.1 seed Sorana Cirstea at Cluj Napoca for first Top 30 win of career
- Also in 2023, made Grand Slam main draw debut at Australian Open as a qualifier and reached 2r at US Open as a qualifier
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2022 Stuttgart reaching 2r as a qualifier and defeated No.38 Viktoria Golubic in 1r while ranked No.342 (l. Swiatek); also in 2022 reached 2r at Lausanne, fell 1r at Hamburg and contested qualifying at Berlin, Wimbledon, US Open and Tallinn
- Contested first WTA qualifying rounds at Hamburg and Linz in 2021
- Won first ITF Circuit singles title at W25 event in Altenkirchen, Germany in March 2020; owns three ITF singles titles
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in United States in 2016
- Went 16-3 on clay at Tour-level events in 2025, including her 18th career title at Rouen, Madrid SF, Rome QF and Roland Garros QF; also made Australian Open QF (l. eventual champion Keys)
- Achieved runner-up in her opening tournament of 2024 at Auckland (l. Gauff in F) before finishing R16 at Australian Open (l. Noskova, retired due to low back injury). Reached QF at Wimbledon (l. Rybakina), 4r at Roland Garros (l. Rybakina) and 3r at US Open (l. Gauff). Ended season after US Open
- Returned to the Tour in April 2023, following birth of daughter Skai. Won Strasbourg (d. Blinkova) for a second time (also in 2020) before achieving Grand Slam results of QF at Roland Garros (l. Sabalenka) and SF at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)
- 2022 season reached 3r at Australian Open (l. Azarenka) and QF at Monterrey (l. Osorio), before going on maternity leave in spring
- Highlight of 2021 was lifting 16th career title at Chicago [250]. Also made SF at Miami, Stuttgart and the Olympics (won bronze medal)
- Won her 14th and 15th titles in 2020, firstly at Monterrey (d. Bouzkova in F) and then Strasbourg (d. Rybakina in F). Contested her 30th consecutive major at 2020 Australian Open (streak ended by missing 2020 US Open)
- In 2019, made first two Grand Slam SFs of career at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Halep) and US Open (l. S.Williams). Became the first woman from Ukraine to reach a major SF (on the men's, Andrei Medvedev made that stage at 1993 and 1999 Roland Garros, finishing runner-up in 1999)
- Also in 2019, made Australian Open QF and reached the title match as defending champion at the Shiseido WTA Finals (l. Barty)
- In 2018, won 13th - and most prestigious - career title at 2018 WTA Finals (d. Stephens in F), after going 3-0 during round robin stage. Ended year ranked No.4. Also won titles at Rome (as defending champion, d. No.1 Halep in F), Dubai (as defending champion, d. Kasatkina in F) and Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F)
- Enjoyed standout 2017, finishing year at No.6, winning a tour-leading five titles and posting second-most wins (53, behind Wozniacki with 60). Season culminated by qualifying for WTA Finals in Singapore, becoming first Ukrainian woman to qualify for the season-ending tournament in singles (fell at round robin stage with 1-2 record)

- In 2017, became first player to win three Premier 5 titles in a single season (Dubai, Rome, Toronto), since such tournaments were introduced in 2009
- One of five players to make Top 10 debut in 2017, after winning Dubai in February (also Ostapenko, Garcia, Mladenovic and Vandeweghe). Peaked in rankings at No.3 on September 11, 2017
- On four occasions could have reached World No.1 - at 2017 US Open, then needed to win 2017 Beijing (fell QF), then needed to triumph at 2017 WTA Finals (fell in group stage), or reach final at 2018 Australian Open (fell in QF)
- End to 2016 season also saw her reach first SF at Premier Mandatory level at Beijing (l. A.Radwanska). Qualified for 2016 WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai for the second time (l. Kvitova in F)
- Reached three finals in 2016, winning Kuala Lumpur (d. Bouchard in F) and R-Up at New Haven (l. A.Radwanska) and Zhuhai (l. Kvitova). Another 2016 season highlight was QF at Rio Olympics
- Owns two career doubles titles: 2014 Istanbul (w/Doi) and 2015 Istanbul (w/Gavrilova)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2012 Baku (lost in 1r but went on to win title there in both 2013 and 2014)
- Played first ITF Circuit events of career in 2008
- Junior highlights include winning 2010 Roland Garros girls' title at age 15 (d. Jabeur in F)
